



## Profile of U.S. Postsecondary Education

### 6,350 Accredited Institutions

Accredited by one of 70 accrediting agencies and whose students may qualify for federal student aid; includes degree-granting institutions.

### 4,200 Degree-Granting Institutions

Includes public, private not-for-profit and private for-profit institutions  
(Approximately 15 million students)

### 1,700 Public Institutions

11.5 million students

### 2,500 Private Institutions

3.5 million students
